

What To Bring To Camp



Pillow and Sleeping bag or twin bed linens for your bunk.

At least (8) sets of clothing, for very HOT weather.

One set of clothes and shoes that you do not mind getting very dirty.

Dressy clothes will not be needed. No need for your Awana Uniform, Trek or Journey Shirt.

Shoes need to be Tennis shoes or other sturdy footwear needed to be worn outside the cabins and at all outside activities. NO BARE FEET or FLIP FLOPS

Swimwear, cover up for to and from pool, and towel

Laundry bag

Flashlight

Bible-notebook-paper-pen-pencils-highlighter

Towels-washcloths-soap-deodorant-shampoo-comb/brush-flip flops/shower shoes-personal items

Toothbrush-toothpaste-sunscreen-chap stick-sun block-insect repellent

Spending money in small bills, the average spending money brought is \$35 to \$40

Your money will be deposited into the camp bank, which is open every day.

During the Wednesday evening worship there is an offering taken up so bring money for that also.

Camera and Film

Water Bottle-Fan (small)-Stamps so you can write home.

Sharpie pen (some campers like to sign each other's team shirt)

If you would like to participate in special music, bring that along, and if you play an instrument and would like to do a special-bring your musical instrument.

Props to use for skits may be brought if not on do not bring list.

This year there will be two water days; be prepared with enough dry clothing
